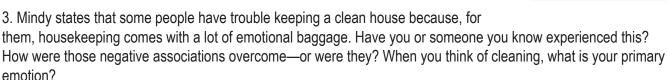
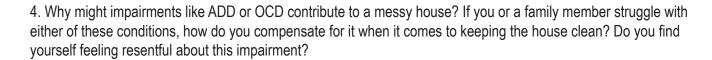
## **Book Group Discussion Questions**
